



2020 Prepared Speech Competition

Competition Type – Individual

Contest Purpose

Poise, self-confidence, and the ability to use effective oral communication skills are valuable qualities of all educators. This event is designed to recognize FGE members who demonstrate these qualities by combining clear thinking and conversational speaking into an interesting presentation on a current education topic.

Competition Guidelines

- A. The prepared speech competition will place during state competition (location and time to be announced).
- B. Contestants must report on time. Failing to report on time will be grounds for disqualification.
- C. Topic must be selected from this list. Speech may take a positive or negative position on the chosen topic.
 - Schools should offer rewards for good test scores.
 - Schools must not sell unhealthy foods.
 - Standardized tests are not a measure of a student's ability.
 - Teachers' pay should be based on performance.
 - School days should start later.
- D. Speeches must be the original work of the student performing the speech. The speech must not have been used in a previous event or in any other competitive event other than the current FGE prepared speech competition.
- E. The content of the prepared speech and the vocabulary must be appropriate for a public audience. The use of profanity is not permitted. The advisor shall listen to his/her competitor's speech and verify the appropriateness of the content.
- F. Note cards may be used; however, the speech may not be read. Over reliance on note cards, where the student actually reads some parts of the speech, represents a poorly prepared speech and will result in deductions in scoring.
- G. The speech must be no less than 3 minutes and no more than 4 minutes long. Deductions in scoring will be made if the speech is not within the proper time limits.
- H. A lectern may/may not be available for the presentation. No microphone will be available.

Judging and Scoring

- A. The judges' decisions are final.
- B. Scoring is based on the Prepared Speech Competition rubric.

Eligibility/How to Enter

- A. To be eligible to compete, a student must have attended an FGE Day during the current school year.
- B. Only one student per chapter may enter.
- C. Entry process is paperless. We will utilize an online entry form. **Entry must be submitted by midnight on March 13, 2020.**
- D. When you arrive at state competition, you will be given your assigned time for presentation.
- E. Arrive at the speech area at your assigned time.
